

The project activities were as follows:

- enhanced opportunities for the community to be involved in the design of the Home Zone, including the implementation of the focal points
- removing camber and replacing with high quality surfaces suitable for walking, cycling, playing as well as providing access for essential vehicles within a safe area
- creation of six focal points for the community to congregate using a combination of street furniture, community art works and landscaping
- community Safety measures through the provision of enhanced lighting, and closing off some access routes, which are regularly used by those, engaged in criminal activity
- replacement of existing drainage system within Robert Street and environs removes existing sub quality system and addresses flooding issues within northern end of Clune Park Street
- refuse and recycling facilities.

PROJECT STRUCTURE

The project was implemented and monitored by Inverclyde Council together with support from the Robert Street Neighbourhood Panel.

Co-ordination and integration with other complementary elements of the Robert Street Renewal Programme were managed through the Robert Street Neighbourhood Panel, which had representatives from residents, all the key agencies, and elected representatives. Construction phase started early May 2004. Supervision of the Construction phase was subject to competitive tendering with day to day reporting to Roads and Transportation and regular progress reports to the Neighbourhood Panel.
